

FORMAL PRESENTATION


"The Battle of Mobile" by Compatriot David Schmitt. Highlights of the brief follow:

The Battle of Mobile Bay of August 5, 1864 was an engagement of the American Civil War in which a Federal fleet commanded by Rear Admiral David G. Farragut, assisted by a contingent of soldiers, attacked a smaller Confederate fleet led by Admiral Franklin Buchanan and three forts that guarded the entrance to Mobile Bay.

The battle was marked by Farragut's seemingly rash but successful run through a minefield that had just claimed one of his ironclad monitors, enabling his fleet to get beyond the range of the shore-based guns. This was followed by a reduction of the Confederate fleet to a single vessel, ironclad CSS Tennessee. Tennessee did not then retire, but engaged the entire Northern fleet. Tennessee's armor enabled her to inflict more injury than she received, but she could not overcome the imbalance in numbers. She was eventually reduced to a motionless hulk and surrendered, ending the battle. With no Navy to support them, the three forts also surrendered within days. Complete control of lower Mobile Bay thus passed to the Union forces.

Mobile had been the last important port on the Gulf of Mexico east of the Mississippi River remaining in Confederate possession, so its closure was the final step in completing the blockade in that region.

This Union victory, together with the capture of Atlanta, was extensively covered by Union newspapers and was a significant boost for Abraham Lincoln's bid for re-election three months after the battle.



MAY 23, 1959 - FEBRUARY 27, 2017



He strongly loved his Confederate heritage and believed belonging to the Sons of Confederate Veterans was a duty and a right. He even recruited his sons, Ben and Andrew to join. Last year, he and his wife, Tammy, suffered a terrible tragedy when their house caught fire and was completely destroyed including its contents. Now, Tammy and his family are suffering another terrible tragedy. We extend our deepest sympathy.

WHY I AM A MEMBER OF THE SONS OF CONFEDERATE VETERANS



BECAUSE I have a deep sense of loyalty to my family and that especially includes my Great Grandfather, who, as a private in the Confederate Army, with no hope of recognition except that his sacrifice would be remembered by his family, gave his life in defense of his country, his home, and for those who would come after him.

BECAUSE I have so much to be proud of in the Confederate Army. Its brilliant fight, under conditions of extreme privation, against an enemy overwhelming in numbers and equipment, so won the admiration of the world that 100 years later, a group of retired British Army and Navy officers organized the Confederate Historical Society of Great Britain, headquartered in London, to study its campaigns. In 1974, a group of Belgians organized the Confederate Historical Society of Belgium, based in Brussels, for the same reason and purpose. The Southern Skirmisher's Association in England re-enacts battles of the War. Some members have to wear the Blue but typical of the sentiment, is one study English Confederate who told a reporter: "... one Southern fighting man was worth two Yankees. I would never be anything but a Southerner." (No other army in history has been paid such a tribute by foreigners over a century after the war in which it was engaged. Are foreigners to admire and honor the valor of the Confederate soldier in my family while I remain indifferent?)

BECAUSE I believe in the promise of the Man of Galilee, of life after death. As my Great Grandfather looks down upon me from the Valhalla of Confederate heroes, I want him to know that I am so ungrateful, that I remember and honor his bravery and sacrifice.

BECAUSE I am proud to be a Southerner. I am proud of the culture, grace and elegance of the Old South. I love the Confederate Flag and "Dixie" as stirring symbols of my heritage. I take pride in the earlier leading role the Old South played in the Revolutionary War, the founding of the United States and the drafting of its Constitution. I love The Star Spangled Banner and the Stars and Stripes as the Flag of the United States, and I served under that Flag in World War II.

BECAUSE our Southern heritage has served our nation well since 1865. No section has surpassed the South in percentage of volunteers to defend our country in time of war. The traditional Southern adherence to our free enterprise system, with its liberty and opportunity for all, has been bulwark against the trend towards the dictatorship of the welfare state with its liberty and opportunity for none.

BECAUSE, even today, some our school books, movies, television programs and press falsely portray Southerners as rebels and traitors who fought to preserve slavery, misleading our children and millions of Americans ignorant of history. Since my family fought for the Confederacy, they thereby falsely malign my family and therefore falsely slander me.

BECAUSE there are those in our country today who would forbid as "offensive" the playing of "Dixie" and the display of the Confederate Flag for which so many Southerners shed their blood; who would destroy the monuments to our Confederate dead; who would erase from our history books all honor to Jefferson Davis, Robert E. Lee, Stonewall Jackson, Nathan Bedford Forrest, Wade Hampton, Jeb Stuart, and our other Southern heroes; who would falsify the principles for which Southerners fought and attempt to shame the South with lies about Andersonville Prison. Their purpose is to undermine the proud heritage of the Southern people. These agitators use propaganda and threats and have the support of some self-seeking politicians, weak-kneed educators and even some of the Federal Judiciary. Ironically, the time has come when it takes a little courage to belong to the Sons of Confederate Veterans, a respected, non-partisan patriotic organization since 1896. Do we Southerners today have that courage or have we grown soft and unworthy of our sires?

As Winston Churchill said, any people with contempt for their heritage have lost faith in themselves and no nation can long survive without pride in its traditions. Our enemies know this. At the same time of the movement to ban the display of the Confederate Flag, during the Vietnam War, we saw our American Flag spat upon, burned, and the flag of an enemy nation with whom we were at war, paraded through the streets of our Nation's Capital.

WHY I AM A MEMBER OF THE SONS OF CONFEDERATE VETERANS (continued)

BECAUSE it is my patriotic duty to my country, and because I intend to defend my family's honor and remember the sacrifice of my Great Grandfather, Wilson L. Dykes, private in the Confederate Army, I belong to the Sons of Confederate Veterans, which is dedicated to preserving our Southern heritage of ourselves, our children, and our children's children, and to seeing that the history of the Confederate States of America and the war fought in its defense, is truthfully recorded.

BECAUSE today, as never before, we need our Southern traditions of strong family ties, religious faith, courage, honor, integrity, respect for womanhood, patriotism, self-reliance and belief in the free enterprise system, if we are to successfully meet the problems facing our nation.

BECAUSE, today, the South needs all of her sons to support the Sons of Confederate Veterans, not only out of duty and family loyalty and pride in our past, but also out of self-interest in preserving for ourselves and our children our way of life.

BECAUSE my membership is not only duty, but a pleasure. It has inspired me to become much better informed about my own family history and heritage and to record it for my children's benefit. I have become better informed about the greatest war ever fought by Americans. I enjoy our social activities, the association with ladies and gentlemen of like background, and many warm friendships that have resulted, both locally, and all over the South.

Those of us who belong to the Sons of Confederate Veterans, do so:

"In testimony of our love, recalling deeds immortal, heroism unsurpassed.
With ranks unbroken, ragged, starved and decimated, the Southern soldier for duty's sake.
Undaunted stood to the front of the battle until no light remained to illumine the field of carnage,
Save the luster of his chivalry and courage."






